Writing Storyboard

When to use: PowerPoint, Essay, Written Report, Newspaper Article, Web page, Script etc.

1. Your task is to develop a storyboard to help you organize your thoughts just like you would if you were developing a music video, television program, or movie.
2. When you write, you should always begin with an introduction where you state what you're going to write about.
3. Then you write about it. On the storyboard, each box represents a paragraph. Label each box with just one to three words that represent what you are going to talk about during that paragraph.
4. Only use as many boxes as you need.
5. If you don't like the sequence that you've placed things, rearrange the boxes until you like the order.
6. Finally, your conclusion should always summarize to remind the reader what you'd just written.
